CHELSEA-DEXTER STEER CLUB BY-LAWS

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The name of this organization shall be Chelsea-Dexter Steer Club. The organization shall be governed by a board of directors appointed by the Chelsea Community Fair Board.
2. The Steer Club shall be open to all youth in the Chelsea and Dexter School Districts. The member must be ten (10) years old by the Fair date, with the last year you may show being your senior year in high school. Membership must be approved by the Steer Club committee.
3. All steers must be purchased on or before November 15th. in the year preceding the showing and sale. Steers must be purchased in a group by a committee consisting of three or more members appointed by the Chelsea Community Fair Board. Such steers are to be distributed to the membership by drawing in a lot.
4. All steers must be inspected and tattooed by a local veterinarian before the drawing in a lot by the members.
5. The initial cost of the steer and insurance:
 - a. Each member must pay for the steer when you pick it up.
 - b. Insurance is included in the cost of the steer.
 - c. The Chelsea State Bank will negotiate a loan if needed.
 - d. You must have financing approved before being a member of the Steer Club.
6. Each member is limited to one steer to be shown and sold as part of the Steer Club. It is possible to show other steers at the fair in the open class; however, open class steers will not be sold.
7. All steers must grade prime, choice, or weigh at least 800 pounds at the time of sale. A determination whether steers are prime or choice will be made by the judge or the Livestock Committee of the Chelsea Community Fair. Steers that do not grade prime or choice or which weigh under 800 pounds will not be sold at the livestock sale.
8. Steers may be displayed at the fair in any group or exhibit as long as it meets the approval of the Fair Board.
9. All eligible steers exhibited by the Steer Club shall be sold at the livestock sale. Any steer that cannot be safely handled will be sold in the livestock barn. The steers will be sold by order of placing in the various classes.
10. Each member must maintain a set of feed records on their steer as recommended by the Board of Directors of the Chelsea Community Fair. Records must be turned in by 12:00 noon on the Tuesday of the Fair Week in order to be able to show and sell market livestock in the following Year's fair. An end price and date of sale will be established before this date.
11. An inspection may be made by the Steer Club Board of Directors at least one month before the fair. Steers should be able to handle at least two weeks before the fair.
12. Exhibitor's age for records classes and showmanship classes is recognized as age as of Aug 31.
13. Steers must be fed, watered, and taken care of at the Fairgrounds. Failure to comply with this regulation is grounds for elimination from the Steer Club for the following year.
14. Steers must be clipped and washed before bringing to the fairgrounds.

REPLACEMENT STEER

1. If the initial steer dies within fourteen (14) days of ownership, the steer may be replaced with a steer of equal quality, same breed and similar weight. The new steer shall be supplied from one of the same breeders, (if available) as the current year steers, and only after approval of the superintendents and the Chelsea Fair Livestock Committee.
2. The member, upon approval shall receive payment from the Chelsea-Dexter Steer Club Self Funded Insurance Account to cover the cost of the initial steer (minus insurance fund costs). Any Difference in cost for the replacement steer shall be paid by the member.
3. The replacement steer shall be weighed and tagged according to the same process set up when receiving the initial club steers.
4. The member shall have limited participation upon receiving a replacement steer.
 - A. The replacement steer will not be eligible to compete for Grand Champion or Reserve Champion Fair Steer.
 - B. The club member shall be required to compete in the appropriate showmanship class.
 - C. The replacement steer will compete in the appropriate weight class (for auction placement). If first place was given, the steer would then be removed from further competition.

- D. The replacement steer will be eligible to compete for Best Rate of Gain (based on adjusted number of days).
- E. The replacement steer shall not be eligible for the Clubs self funded insurance if payment was received for the initial steer.

SWINE CLUB RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The name of the organization shall be the Chelsea-Dexter School District Swine Club. The organization shall be governed by a 2 or 3 member Board of Directors which is appointed annually by the Chelsea Community Fair Board.
2. The Swine Club shall be open to all farm youth in the Chelsea-Dexter School District. The member must be six (6) years old by August 31st, with the last year you may show being your senior year in high school.
3. Swine maximum weight at initial spring weigh-in is 150 lbs.
4. All pigs must be purchased before the third Saturday in May, at which date the pigs will be tagged. A maximum of four pigs may be tagged per person.
5. Pigs weighing under 200 pounds at fair weigh-in can not be shown or sold. Pigs weighing over 270 pounds at fair weigh-in can be shown and sold. However, the buyer will only pay for 270 pounds.
6. Each member is limited to two swine to be shown and sold as part of the Swine Club. It will be possible to show other swine at the Fair in the Open Class; however, these will not be sold.
7. Swine may be displayed at the Fair in any group or display as long as it meets the approval of the superintendent.
8. Pigs will be sold by order of placing in the different classes as established by the superintendent.
9. Each member must maintain a set of records on their swine as recommended by the Board of Directors of the Chelsea Community Fair. Records must be turned in to the Superintendent by 1:00 p.m. on the Wednesday of the Fair Week, in order to be eligible to be able to show and sell for the following years fair.

10. An inspection may be made by the Swine Club Board of Directors at least one (1) month prior to the Fair.
11. Members must attend at least three (3) meetings to be eligible to sell at the Fair.
12. Dues will be established as needed.
13. Every member must show in the Showmanship Class as established by the superintendent, unless a member has permission from the superintendent not to show.
14. Senior Swine Showmanship winner must participate in Sweepstates Showmanship or forfeit the Swine Showmanship award unless approved by the Superintendent.

LAMB CLUB RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The name of the organization shall be the Chelsea-Dexter School District Lamb Club. The organization shall be governed by 2 or 3 superintendents which are appointed annually by the Chelsea Community Fair Board.
2. This club will be open to youth of the combined Chelsea-Dexter School Districts. Members must be six (6) years old on or before August 31st of that fair year with the last year you may show being your senior year in high school.
3. All lambs should be in the member's possession by the first week in May, when there will be an announced weigh-in at the Chelsea Fairgrounds. Only wether and ewe lambs are eligible. Ownership will be established at Spring weigh-in/tagging day and cannot be changed or traded thereafter.
4. Lambs will be tagged at weigh-in and must have tags on when entering the Fair and Livestock Sale. Any damaged, lost or torn out tags must be immediately reported to superintendent or lamb will be ineligible.
5. No lamb will weigh more than 85 pounds at weigh-in. There is no limit on top end weight at fair weigh-in.
6. Each member can weigh in four lambs, but can only show and sell two lambs.
7. Lambs are ineligible if after Spring weigh-in they have been consigned or sold at previous auctions or any other type of transaction, even if the exhibitor "buys back" his/her animal.
8. Lambs weighing under 90 pounds at fair weigh-in can be shown but will not be sold. Lambs weighing over 150 pounds at fair weigh-in can be shown and sold. However, the buyer will

only pay for 150 pounds.

9. No lamb will be sold at the auction if it is not judged market quality by the Superintendent and/or Judge.
10. An inspection may be made by the Lamb Club Superintendent anytime prior to the fair.
11. Lambs shall be trimmed to the best of the member's ability. Shearing style to be left to the member's decision.
12. Class weigh-in will take place upon arrival at the Fair on Tuesday, opening day of the Fair. There must be a family representative at the weigh-in or the lamb will not be weighed. Any problem with attendance must be cleared with the Superintendent.
13. Dues will be established as needed.
14. A member or a family member must attend at least 50 percent of meetings and/or work sessions. Failure to do so may result in disqualification from this year's show.
15. Each member must maintain a set of records on their lamb as recommended by the Board of Directors of the Chelsea Community Fair. Records must be turned in to the Superintendent by 12:00 noon on the Wednesday of the Fair Week, in order to be eligible to show and sell for the following year. An end price and date of sale will be established before this date.
