3. All birds will be checked for disease when they are entered. All birds must also be pullorum-typhoid tested. Sick birds will be sent home.
4. All entries must be shown as pairs, consisting of one male and one female. Exhibitors may enter no more than 2 pair of birds per class.
5. Entry fee is \$1.00 per pen. Pre-entry forms need to be received by August 17, 2006.

 Make all checks and money orders payable to Chelsea Community Fair.
7. Birds may be cooped on Monday, August 21. between 4:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m.
8. All birds will be judged on Tuesday, August 22 starting at 11:00 a.m. All birds will be judged according to the Standard of Perfection.
9. We will take every possible precaution to insure health and safety of birds; however, Chelsea Community Fair will not be responsible for loss of stock on exhibit at the Fair.
10. ALL EXHIBITS must remain on display until 8:00 A.M. on Sunday, August 27.
 Please pick up exhibits between 8:00 A.M. and 9:00 A.M. on Sunday, August 27.
 Superintendents cannot be held responsible for poultry left after 9:00 am.
11. Feed and water will be provided by Chelsea Community Fair for exhibitors to feed their poultry.
12. Production Pens will consist of three females, 5 months to 1 year old.
13. Meat pens will consist of three birds of the same sex.

2. Exhibitor Fee is \$10 per exhibitor. This fee must be sent with the entry form, see #10 below.
3. Each exhibitor can purchase an "exhibitor pass" from the fair office for \$15.00. This permits a vehicle and a driver onto the fairgrounds through the exhibitor/handicap gate. All other persons in the vehicle will be required to pay the daily fee or the season pass fee.
4. Age of exhibitor is determined as of January 1, 2006. Anyone 19 years old and younger as of January 1, 2006 is eligible to enter.
5. 4-H Rules will apply. Reference:4-H Horse & Pony Project Show Rules & Regulations (revised 2003).
6. Stall space will be given to residents of the Chelsea & Dexter School Districts first. If the barn does not fill with Chelsea/Dexter exhibitors, entries from other local areas will be accepted. Other

- local areas MUST have their entry in by July 1 to be considered for a stall. Please mail entries early as stalls are filled first come, first served. Entry fee will be returned if a stall is not available.
7. Only one horse per exhibitor allowed. A horse can be used by more than one rider. Additional riders must fill out an entry form & it must be received by July 1, 2006, see #10 below.
 8. Walk/Trot exhibitors are not eligible for walk/trot/canter classes. You will remain a walk/trot exhibitor through-out the fair.
 9. A copy of the current year NEGATIVE COGGINS TEST must accompany entry form.

 11. The classes listed will be split between Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday. Class order is subject to change. Class lists will be posted in the barn. Classes will not begin before 9 a.m.
 12. Saturday will be a day with fun classes, no pre-entry necessary. No premiums will be given but special prizes will be awarded. Classes will be posted in the barn. There will be a break for the parade. Also there will be horse/pony costume class after the parade.

 19. 8 yrs & under are eligible for only classes with an * or **. 8 yrs & under are NOT ELIGIBLE for Championship classes or High Point Awards.
 20. **Leadline exhibitors are eligible for ONLY Leadline classes.**
 21. CHAMPIONSHIP classes: All 1st and 2nd place winners of each halter class & each showmanship class are to show in the appropriate championship class (8 yrs and under not eligible).

3. The Antique Tractor Pulling Contest is limited to 1940 and earlier models.
4. All tractors must be weighed in at the Chelsea Fairgrounds on Thursday, August 24 between 7:30 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. Tractors in light class should be weighed by 8:30 a.m. Pull will begin at 9:00 a.m. **SHARP**. Tractor to be weighed with driver on the seat. Contest Officials reserve the right to re-weigh winners.
5. Entry fee is \$10.00. Percentage pull on cement slab.
6. All participants must be at least 14 years of age. Cards must be signed by parents of minors (under 18 years of age) before tractors will be weighed.
7. Class 2390 (Women's Powder Puff) will be first class to pull. Tractors are to be 1940 and earlier. Tractor and/or driver can enter in classes 2391-2394 after participating in the powder puff.
8. Tractors are allowed wheel weights or channel weights front and rear. Weights should be fastened securely and not interfere with hook. Any weights or objects falling from tractor during the pull will disqualify contestant.
9. Drawbar or point of pull not to exceed 18 inches from the grounds and no less than 18 inches from center of rear axle unless manufactured otherwise. Pull from factory drawbar or safe equipment.
10. Clevis to have 3 inches minimum hole for hook. A large twist clevis preferred. Homemade clevis should be 3/4 inch plate bolted tightly. D clevis will be allowed if bolted tightly, no shims.
11. No cut down smooth tires, no industrial tires, no wear between lugs, no dual wheels allowed. Wheels shall be size and type available at time of manufacture or early conversion from steel.
12. No 4 wheel drive, no altered tractors. Tractors must be complete such as hoods, air cleaners, etc.
13. Each driver allowed only one tractor in each class. Each tractor is limited to one class.
14. Driver will be allowed 30 seconds to complete their pull after starting. Two pulls will be allowed if needed. Second pull will be taken immediately after first pull. (unless mechanical failure) (first time 3 pulls if needed).
15. During the pull you are allowed to use brakes. You cannot shift up or down or disengage clutch, front wheels are not allowed to remain over 18 inches off the ground. Bouncing will be allowed if driver remains on seat. If chain jerks or is slack during pull, whistle will blow and pull is over.
16. RPM not exceed 15% of factory recommendations. MPH not to exceed 5 mph.
17. Tractor must have original looking block.

RULES

1. Please read general rules and regulations beginning on page 12.
2. Contestants must provide the Superintendent with their Social Security Number.
3. Pull will begin at 9:00 a.m. **SHARP**. This is a dead-weight pull on cement for the first three classes. All tractors must be weighed in at Chelsea Fairgrounds according to the following schedule. Scales open at 8:00 a.m. Tractors up to 3,750 pounds (Class 2400) are to be weighed by 8:30 a.m.; Tractors in classes 2401 and 2402 to be weighed by 9:30 a.m. All tractors in classes 2403 - 2411 should be weighed in between 4:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m.
4. Entry fee is \$15.00 for Farm Stock classes. Entry fee is \$20.00 for Super and Pro Stock.
5. All participants must be at least 14 years of age. Cards must be signed by parents of minors (under 18 years of age) before tractors will be weighed.
6. Contest is open to rubber tired, wheel type farm tractors. Not materially altered from original factory specifications. No 4-wheel drives. No cut down, smooth tires allowed. No wear between treads. No industrial or knobby tires.
7. Entry limited to one tractor per class, and one driver per tractor. Each tractor allowed in one class only.
8. Winner will be determined on a maximum deadweight basis. Tractor pulling greatest weight in each class will be the winner. Full pull is completed when marker is tipped over.
9. Drawbar height for classes 2400, 2401, and 2402 limited to 18 inches. Tractors over 6,000 pounds can have a drawbar height to 20". The drawbar cannot be raised after the pull has started. If you have to pull off more than once because of drawbar height, you will be disqualified. Must not be more than 1 inch of washers between drawbar and clevis.
10. Each contestant will receive three pulling chances at first weight, two pulling chances at each weight thereafter. Clevis should have 3 inch minimum hole for hook. Clevis to be flat and parallel to ground. Thirty second time limit per pull. No jerking allowed. Brake or differential lock can be used.
11. R.P.M.s will be checked on all tractors. Tractors may not exceed more than 15% over factory recommendations and not exceed 5 mph. If the R.P.M.s are too high, it will have to be changed before they pull or you will be disqualified. If the judge questions the R.P.M.s, they can also be checked after the pull.
12. Front end height will be no higher than 24 inches. The judge can and will stop the pull if they feel you are operating unsafely.
13. Wheelie bars can be on the tractor for safety, but if they touch the concrete, the pull is over.
14. Tractors will be weighed in with driver. No driver changes allowed after weigh-in. All weights to be bolted or affixed in a secure manner. If a weight is not secure, it must be made safe or taken off.
15. No modified tractors.
16. There cannot be any support of drawbar or clevis with a three-point hitch top link.
17. Absolutely no drinking of alcoholic beverages during contest either on or around Fairgrounds.
18. All rules will be interpreted by the superintendent and the official judges until the start of the contest, thereafter, the judges decision will be final.
19. The superintendent in charge of pull will have full power in any dispute or matter not covered in rules.
20. No standing on tractor during pull even if it appears driver is sitting in seat.

RULES FOR FARM STOCK-SPEED PULL EVENT

Friday Evening, August 25

(Classes 2403 - 2411)

1. All tractors are to be farm owned and pulled as worked on the farm.
2. Contestants may use brakes, differential locks, torque converters and auto shifts.
3. No L.P. gas topper or pressurized tank.
4. All tractors must be in neutral or park while being hitched or unhitched.
5. All pulls must start with a tight hitch, no jerking permitted.
6. Contestants will be allowed two consecutive attempts within 75 feet to start the sled.
7. Number one puller will be test puller and may take pull if weight machine is operating properly, or he may pull in 3rd position. If machine needs further adjustment, first puller after each adjustment will be treated as number one puller. On any re-pull caused by a contest malfunction, puller, at his discretion, may drop back 3 positions.
8. Contestants will receive their number as they are weighed in. Once the class has started, no numbers will be distributed for that class. Contestant must pull in order drawn within 3 minutes of the time after sled is in readiness; any delay will mean disqualification.
9. Tractor and sled must remain within boundaries of course during the pull, or be disqualified.
10. No one is allowed on the track except for track officials and contestant; no helpers.
11. All tractors and drivers must re-weigh IMMEDIATELY after they have completed their pull. Any tractor found to be overweight will be disqualified. THIS RULE WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.
12. A Farm Stock tractor is not allowed to exceed 15% over manufacturer's recommendations.

Also beginning in 1992, a specific contract for the Chelsea Community Fair Queen was implemented which explains the Queens duties and the requirements that need to be fulfilled to be eligible for the \$1,000.00 Scholarship.

3. An entry fee of \$7.00 will be charged at time of weigh-in for each tractor.
4. Each driver is allowed only one tractor per class.

11. Only the driver will be allowed on the tractor; he/she must stay at the controls and in the seat while the tractor is pulling. He/she must keep at least one (1) hand on the steering wheel while the tractor is moving.
12. The committee in charge reserves the right to accept or reject any or all entries.
13. All tractors will be equipped with an anti-rollover device capable of supporting the weight of the tractor and driver.
14. Class numbers 3050, 3051, and 3052 are for uncut turf tires only. (New rule)
15. Class number 3053 is for any rubber tire cut or uncut, turf or bar tires. (New rule)
16. Tractors must be weighed in between 7:30 am and 9:00 am, on the day of the pull.
17. There is a five minute limit for repairs or adjustments.

RULES

1. Please read general rules and regulations beginning on page 12.
2. The parade is to begin at 1:00 p.m. sharp.
3. ALL CANDY THROWN DURING THE PARADE MUST NOT HAVE STICKS. ALSO ALL CANDY THROWN MUST BE THROWN TO THE CURB AND NOT DROPPED ALONG SIDE OF VEHICLE/FLOAT FOR SAFETY REASONS.
4. Each Queen candidate must have a float on which to ride and **float must have a permit**, in order to participate in the parade.
5. **Float permits may be obtained by calling Chelsea Fire Dept. at 475-8755, and leaving your Name, Your Address, The Name of the Organization, and a Phone Number at which you can be contacted. The permit will be mailed to you.** (See Float Participants Requirements on next page)
6. School bands are to form in the alley of the Municipal Parking lot off of East Street.
7. All horses and horse drawn vehicles are to line up on Park Street between Main and East Streets, facing east between 12:15 and 12:30 p.m. All riders are to keep the horses in the roadway, not on lawns and sidewalks. Failure to comply is cause to be removed from the parade.
8. NO STALLIONS OVER 1 YEAR OF AGE ALLOWED.
9. ALL HORSES MUST SHOW PROOF OF A NEGATIVE EIA TEST (better known as Coggins test)
10. All farm machinery is to line up on the east side of East Street from Park Street south, facing north.
11. All antique vehicles are to line up on the south side of Harrison Street, from East to Madison Streets, facing west.
12. All trucks and miscellaneous vehicles are to line up on East Street, from Park Street south, on westside.
13. Fire Trucks and Emergency Vehicles are to line up on the south side of Park, facing west, starting at East Street.
14. A motorcycle or minibike or ATV must be ridden in a safe manner. Riders 16 and younger need to be accompanying by adults, no "wheelies" or horse play.
15. NO BICYCLES will be allowed during the Chelsea Community Fair Parade.
16. Any unit in the parade not covered elsewhere in the above rules should contact one of the firemen for a starting place.
17. Any delays caused in parade by a parade entry, that entry will not be permitted back the following year.
18. Units are to be in their positions by 12:00 noon, except floats which are to be **completed** and in line, **with Judges Cards filled out by 11:00 a.m.** for judging. FLOATS ARRIVING AFTER 11:00 a.m. AND COMPLETED WILL NOT BE JUDGED. They must be completed and in line At 11:00 a.m. to be judged.
19. Floats are to line up on the north side of Park Street between East and Madison Streets, facing west, tow vehicles must stay with floats at all times. All vehicles pulling floats are to be limited to two persons in the cars, this will help avoid accidents and help the appearance of the floats. All hitches are to have a nut holding the pin. The float prize winners will be posted immediately after the parade.

FLOAT PARTICIPANTS REQUIREMENTS

1. All floats must be assembled on either a farm wagon or flat bed trailer able to be towed by a car, truck, or trailer.
2. All floats must be in position, and completely assembled and decorated by 11:00 a.m., unless you wish your float not be judged for placement or prize (No Exception)
3. A judging card must be completely filled out and presented at time of judging or points will be deducted.
4. Float Judges are to judge each float, not the Queen candidates or her court, unless they are part of the theme or design of the float.
5. If candy is thrown from the float, the candy must make it to the curb. **Candy with sticks is NOT allowed.** If this rule is not met, you will be asked to stop throwing the candy.
6. If children or other participants are part of the float theme, they must be with the float at the time of judging
7. The vehicle used to tow the float must be in place when the float lines up.
8. Driver of the tow vehicle must stay with the vehicle/float.
9. All floats must have a draw pin with safety pin in place or a ball hitch with a safety pin.

11. The exhaust pipe on the generator, must be routed to remove the fumes away from the participants.
12. Driver of a self-propelled float must have a clear view of parade route.
13. A safety inspection will be conducted. The crew will inspect each float to confirm that all guidelines have been met. If any violations are found, the safety crew retains the right to have the float withdrawn from the parade. **The decision of the safety crew is final**

60 car limit Tuesday night. One compact car heat Wednesday night. (4 cylinder only, front engine car with wheel base of 104" or less. No Utility or 4 wheel drive vehicles)

RULES AND REGULATIONS (Strictly enforced)

1. Each and every driver is required to fill out an entry blank. **Driver's Social Security Number must be provided.**
2. Derby officials may accept or reject any and all entries.
3. All derby drivers, owners, mechanics, pit crew and wrecker drivers are required to sign a RELEASE AND WAIVER OF LIABILITY INDEMNITY AGREEMENT day of exhibition with pit gate sign in official before entering race track and/or exhibition area or motorized pit area. Absolutely NO MINORS in the above specified locations. All persons must be 18 years of age or older to drive.
4. No car will be allowed on the track prior to the heat in which it is to participate.
5. Intoxicating beverages and drugs, or the use of such, are prohibited prior to or during the event.
6. Derby drivers and crew are independent contractors, not employees of the Association or promoter.
7. Last two cars moving on its own power making visible contact with another car will be officially proclaimed the winner. Derby officials have the option of changing this at driver's meeting. Feature Event: Winner and Runner-up unless there is a tie.
8. Heat and feature winners will receive money plus trophies.
9. Any vehicles displaying obscenities will be disqualified; only commercial advertising and car number permitted. Driver's door and passenger's door must be painted white. This space is for car number only, no letters, symbols or fraction of numbers.
10. Car may be driven in one heat only and is not eligible to return in another heat.
11. **MANDATORY: Vehicle Title must be presented to officials in order to participate in derby**
12. **THE DECISION OF THE JUDGES AND DERBY OFFICIALS WILL BE FINAL!**

DRIVER'S ENTRY

1. Driver must have a valid driver's license in possession for inspection when signing in day of exhibition. **NO MINORS.** Must be 18 years of age or older
2. All drivers must supply their own car and may enter one heat only unless otherwise informed at driver's meeting.
3. Any driver and/or crew member disobeying the rules will cause his car to be disqualified.
4. Eligibilities for feature event must be a heat winner and/or runner-up. Drivers may use any previous heat car in feature, providing said car passes inspection.

TIME LIMIT-If a driver does not hit a car within the time specified, announced by derby officials, or officials feel driver is deliberately sand bagging, driver and car will be disqualified.

SPECIAL NOTICE: MAXIMUM running of DERBY two (2) hours. Officials will explain at driver's meeting maximum time limit of each heat.

INSPECTION - Derby officials reserve the right to inspect any and all cars entered in the Demolition contest at any time.

DISPOSAL OF CARS - All cars participating in the Derby must be removed from the fairgrounds by 12:00 o'clock midnight, day of exhibition, unless another time or extension is announced at Driver's meeting.

CAR REGULATIONS

1. Any Front engine, hard top car or station wagon is allowed, with the exception no Chrysler Imperials, no trucks, compacts, jeeps, carryalls, etc. Car is to be as near factory stock as possible, no external or auxiliary transmission cooler.

2. Safety belts and approved safety helmets are required and must be worn. Shoulder harness recommended.
3. All glass including windshield, head lights, tail lights, mirrors, etc., must removed. Car must be swept clean of all dirt and loose pieces. ALL THIS WORK must be done before entering the fairgrounds.
4. A maximum of 3 gallons of gas will be permitted. **Original gas tank must be removed and not used in any location**; a boat type tank or equivalent thereof may be placed in rear of car. The tank must be flat, no upright 5 gallon cans. Gas line or hose must be secure to nozzle of tank with hose clamp. Tank must be securely fastened to floor of car. A non-flammable fire wall is required over tank. If car is originally factory equipped with electric fuel pump, a kill switch must be in driver's compartment.
5. **Coil or leaf springs are permissible, if coils are changed to leafs the following standard must be met. No chaining up or down any suspension, welding to any spring or spring support. Car springs only. Seven factory stair step leafs, no inversion of leafs, one bolt on clamp equal to factory clamp front and rear. Factory workable shackles only. No struts on rear factory shocks. Rear of car must bounce freely. No special bumpers, trailer hitches, or reinforcements will be permitted. No body seam welding. Car can not be tucked, must have access to trunk. A three inch diameter safety bar is permissible with a six inch flange on each side, from driver's windshield post to passenger post and behind seat post to post. Stock factory rubber body mounts in original position with original body bolts and factory inserts in place. No additional mounts or bolts are allowed.**
6. Drivers are to keep their cars in the boundary lines at all times. If a car is pushed, shoved or driven out of bounds and Derby Officials feel a hazard to spectators, car will be eliminated and disqualified immediately.
7. All doors must be fastened shut by wire, straps or welding. Driver's door reinforcement permissible. (All cars must have hoods over engine compartment).
8. Hoods and trunk lids may be held down by wire, provided the wire is attached to the trunk or hood and hooked to adjacent sheet metal only. A quick release type is required on trunk and hood in case of fire. The hood and trunk must be opened during inspection prior to event. Welding or banding straps on car hood, and trunk prohibited. This also applies to luggage compartment.
9. All chrome and decorative ornaments including all fiber glass must be removed from outside of car. Protruding fenders and/or tail light fins must be cut off or bent over. Suggest three safety straps equally spaced from top to bottom of windshield.
10. You must stay in your car. Do not leave your car unless you are told to do so by an official or the last car has stopped.
11. Batteries may be moved to any reasonable position in the car, but they must be securely fastened to the car and must be covered with a suitable shield.
12. Radiator must remain in original position. Any vehicle leaking fuel will be eliminated. A visible fire results in disqualification.
13. No implement or off road tires, no studded, no bead lock screws in rim, no wheel weights.
14. Cars must have brakes prior to and during all heats.
15. Additional safety regulations may be imposed at the time of the Derby due to track conditions.
16. All drivers must be signed in with Derby Officials one half hour before program starting time.
17. Any driver protesting another car must do so at driver's meeting.

DERBY OFFICIALS SHALL INSPECT CAR BEING PROTESTED WITH THE PERSON FILING PROTEST. DERBY OFFICIALS' DECISION FINAL!

THESE RULES AND REGULATIONS DO NOT IMPLY OR GUARANTEE SAFETY

The rules and/or regulations set forth herein are designed to provide for the orderly conduct of racing events and to establish minimum acceptable requirements for such events. These rules shall govern the condition of all events, and by participating in these events, all participants are deemed to have complied with these rules. NO EXPRESS OR IMPLIED WARRANTY OF SAFETY SHALL RESULT FROM PUBLICATIONS OF OR COMPLIANCE WITH THESE RULES AND/OR REGULATIONS. They are intended as a guide for the conduct of the sport and are in no way a guarantee against injury or death to a participant, spectator or official.

The race director shall be empowered to permit minor deviation from any of the specifications herein or impose any further restrictions that in his opinion do not alter the minimum acceptable requirements. NO EXPRESSED OR IMPLIED WARRANTY OF SAFETY SHALL RESULT FROM SUCH ALTERATION OF

SPECIFICATIONS. Any interpretation or deviation of these rules is left to the discretion of the officials. Their decision is final.

CHANGES:

1. Two (2) safety straps (1/8" x 2" solid steel strap bolted or welded one on each side) or bars securely attached from bottom of windshield is necessary.
2. Reinforcement to driver's door allowed - no concrete.
3. Original gas tank must be removed.
4. Original bumpers must remain on car.
5. Cars that ran in last year's derby at the Chelsea fair are allowed, all others must be fresh cars. No fresh car may be used for final heat.
6. If there is a hole in the fire wall, it must be covered with sheet metal. No filling the hole with carpet or seat material the day of derby.

ADDITIONS:

1. No extra weights of any kind may be added.
2. Car tires only and air only.
3. No entries after 6:30 p.m. on the evening of the derby.
4. Hood hold down maximum 2 chain's no more than 24".
5. A BOAT TYPE TANK or equivalent thereof must be placed in rear of car. The tank must be flat, no upright 5 gallon cans. Gas line or hose must be secure to nozzle of tank with hose clamp. Tank must be securely fastened to floor of car. A non-flammable fire wall is required over tank. Gas line must be ran through fire wall on floor under seat.
6. Tires can not be screwed to rim, no studded tires.
7. Excessive body crimping not allowed.
8. Fuel injected cars must have fuel shut off switch.
9. A hole must be in hood, not to exceed 12".
10. NO welded or chained motor mounts.
11. Batteries must be moved to passenger compartment inside the car.
12. No fast clips with cables to fasten hood - **MUST BE CHAINED.**
13. The metal bars on the windshield must be evenly spaced to prevent hood from coming thru to driver.
14. Steel fuel line must be used instead of rubber thru fire wall.
15. All cars entered must have title at time of entry.
16. The winning driver of the Feature on Tuesday cannot run in any event on Wednesday.
17. If you have an injury that requires you to wear a cast anywhere on your body, you will not be allowed to run.

Additions to the 2004 Derby Rules:

1. Hood can be held down with a maximum of two chains that are **no longer than 60 inches.**
2. Front and rear bumpers **can only be looped one time.** The chain **must go through the hood and the trunk deck once** on each side of the car.
3. Excessive body crimping **NOT** allowed.
4. **No welded motor mounts;** however, they can be chained.
5. **Steel fuel line must be used** instead of rubber fuel line through the firewall, with a minimum length of 36 inches.
6. High-pressure fuel hose **MUST** be used on ALL cars with fuel injection.
7. **Reinforcement of the driver's door is MANDATORY!** However, **NO CEMENT, GUARDRAIL, I BEAM OR H BEAM** can be used. The reinforcement must be 6 inches past driver's door on each side.
